✓ Maintain contact with pet owner mid-month:

- Check if there have been any changes in their cat's behavior
- Ensure appointments are on track
- Keep pet owner and cat ambassador in touch

TIP: Select a cat ambassador for your practice. This person can take the lead on scheduling, answering questions, or any other cat-related needs.
